

PE

Library

Show and tell sessions will be on Wednesdays. Please encourage your child to bring something from home that is linked to the topic or something special of interest rather than just a toy. Show and Tell will start from next week (w/c 13.01.20).

Playground

Thank you to all parents who have supported our lining up routines for the beginning and end of the school day. From **Monday**, we ask all parents to say goodbye to their child before sending them through the gate. The children have settled extremely well into our classroom routines and we would like this to continue.

Curriculum

During this year we will follow the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) as a comprehensive framework. Your child will be learning skills, acquiring new knowledge and demonstrating their understanding through seven areas of learning and development. Children should mostly develop the three prime areas first.

These are:

- Communication and language
- Physical development
- Personal, social and emotional development

These prime areas are those most essential for your child's healthy development and future learning.

As children grow, the prime areas will help them to develop skills in four specific areas.

These are:

- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding the world; and
- Expressive arts and design

These seven areas are used to plan your child's learning and activities, offering flexibility so that staff can follow your child's unique needs and interests.

Children in EYFS learn by playing and exploring, being active, and through creative and critical thinking which takes place both indoors and outside.

We thank you very much for your support this first week and we look forward to a successful first term. The children have been fantastic and have settled into our classroom routines extremely well.
