

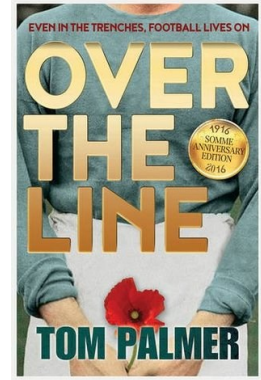

English

Reading

Our class text is *Over The Line* by Tom Palmer, which is about a footballer, Jack, who finds himself fighting on the western front in WWI. In order to keep his football dreams alive, he will need to survive the trenches. The skills we will focus on learning this term are: improving our speed with retrieval from the text and developing our understanding of vocabulary.



Writing

This term, we will be learning to write a character description, with a focus on describing a WWI soldier. Later on in the term, we will be writing a diary recount from the trenches.

STEM

Maths

This term, we will be learning about the following: addition and subtraction; multiplication and division; and place value.

This term, indoor PE will concentrate on Dodgeball, whilst in outdoor PE the children will be developing their skills to play outdoor conditioned games. DT

This term, we will be developing and making soup recipes similar to those that would've been made during World War I.

Music

This half term, children will be learning to use Traktor 2 – a basic DJ app to manipulate sound, loop, hot cue and create their own remixes. Pupils will develop a better understanding of the inter-related dimensions of music and use their listening skills to illicit key elements and structure within pieces.

We will be learning all about World War I and its impact locally. We will be visiting Shuttleworth in late October to support this learning.
