




Reading

The skills we will focus on learning this term are: VIPERS (vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation, retrieval and summarising).



Writing

This term, we will be learning to write a character description using a range of grammar and figurative language writing techniques. Children will create their own peculiar character using examples from their reading. Later on in the term, we will be writing persuasively, using grammar tools such as rhetorical questions and expanded noun phrases.

Practice Makes Perfect

Maths

This term, we will be learning about the following: Number and place value; Addition and subtraction and Multiplication and division.

As always, times tables form the basis of so many other areas of Maths. Children should practice their times tables at least 3 times per week on <u>Times Tables Rock Stars.</u>

Science

This term, we will be leaning about living things and their habitats. We will focus on learning about Carl Linnaeus' method known as taxonomy and our scientific enquiry will lead us to explore a range of classification systems and keys to help us identify different animals and plants.

This term, your child will be learning how to participate in, and play, dodgeball. They will also be learning how to play conditioned games. Children should come to school dressed in their PE kit on the following days: Monday and Tuesday. Art

This term, we will focus on the work of local artist Edward Bawden, with a focus on print-making, using lino tiles.

Computing

Children will develop their knowledge and understanding of using a computer to produce 3D models. Children will initially familiarise themselves with working in a 3D space, including combining 3D objects to make a house and examining the differences between working digitally with 2D and 3D graphics.

Personal. Social and Health Education

This term, our PSHE learning will focus on the development of safe relationships with family and friends. We will also be talking about how to respect ourselves and others.

Music

In Music this half term children will be try beat-boxing and creating vocal ostinatos that they can loop to create a piece. We will look at musicians who use their voices in unconventional ways, from Scat to Yodelling! Their ideas will be recorded and they will manipulate these using features on garage band to create a finished piece.


Humanities
