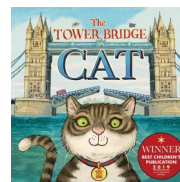

Writing

We will explore adjectives and prepositional openers within this piece of writing. In addition to this, we will write a diary entry of The Great Fire of London, recalling the main events from the perspective of a very small flea named Vlad and his friend Boxton, the rat.

Maths

This half term, we will be continuing to learn about addition, subtraction and shape. We will be working on securing the fundamentals of number, particularly adding and subtracting, using written methods. The children will continue to practise their 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Please practise your skills on Number Bots regularly.

Science

In science this half term, pupils will be identifying and comparing everyday materials. We will explore the different materials we have in our environment and begin to sort materials using simple Venn diagrams. We will then conduct experiments to see what we can change.

Computing

Pupils will develop an understanding of instructions in sequences and the use of logical reasoning to predict outcomes. Pupils will use given commands in different orders to investigate how the order affects the outcome. They will design algorithms and test them.

The Arts

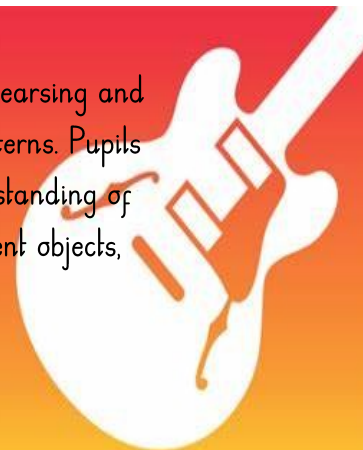
Design Technology

Humanities



History

This term, children will be learning about the Great Fire of London. They will become detectives and investigate the significant events that caused the fire and the devastating effects it had on the city. Children will learn about the changes that took place after the fire and about significant figures at this time, such as Thomas Farrinior, Samuel Pepys, Thomas Bloodworth and King Charles the II.

Religious Education

This half term, we will learn about how we care for others and how our actions can affect the environment and the world. We will explore a few sacred texts.
