Reading

During our class reading time, we will be reminding ourselves of some classic fairy tales, but also looking at some that have been 'mixed up'. Our first text will be 'Who's Afraid of the Big Bad Book?' which is about a boy who gets stuck in a fairy tale world!

Writing

Have you ever wondered if the Big Bad Wolf was really that bad? Was Goldilocks actually that mischievous and did Rapunzel definitely need rescuing? We will be looking at mixing up classic fairy tales and giving them a modern twist by changing the beginning or ending of a classic story.

We will also be learning about influential authors and writing a biography on the fascinating life of Roald Dahl. Finally, we will be writing our own verses to Kit Wright's poem, 'The Magic Box'.

Maths

Throughout this term, we will be exploring a variety of mathematical concepts which incorporate many skills; money, multiplication and division, mass and capacity and length and height will be at the centre of our learning. Reasoning and problem solving within all these areas will be incorporated throughout this half term.

Science

The enquiry process we are focusing on this half term is 'Research'. We will be researching animals including humans. We are going to be exploring the basic survival needs of animals and describe the importance for humans of healthy eating, exercise and hygiene.

Computing

Pupils will be looking at how data can be collected using J2E Pictogram and will ask and answer questions based on this data.

Physical Education

Indoors, we will explore some gymnastic skills such as rolling, jumps with tucks and travel whilst in flight using apparatus. Outside, we will explore fundamental movements such as throwing, catching and kicking. We will use these skills within some target

Personal. Social and Health Education

This half term, we will be learning about living in the wider world — and the communities we belong to. During these lessons we will look at roles and responsibilities within different groups and how communities function. We will look at our own responsibilities and what groups we are a part of.



We will be drawing things that we have seen or imagined using pencils and other tools to make different marks. We will create tone using pencil, chalk or charcoal. We will explore the work of artists such as an Van Gogh or Monet to identify colours, lines, shapes and medium.

Music

In Music, we will be rehearsing and creating rhythmical patterns. Pupils will develop their understanding of how instruments represent objects, moods and feelings.

Humanities



History- This term the pupils will be learning about significant individuals in the past who have contributed to national and international achievements. We will be using these individuals to compare and contrast aspects of life in different periods of time.

Geography This term our main focus is History but we will take a couple of lessons to focus on the capital cities and countries of the UK?

Religious Education

This half term, we will be focusing on the questions— 'Who is an inspiring person?' and 'What stories inspire Christian, Muslim and Jewish people?'
