Tier 2 vocabulary



Pupils are participating in a LEAP project with professional dancers and digital technology producers to access areas of the computing / dance / music curriculum, in various modern real-life relevant ways.




Physical Education

Children will participate in Gymnastics within their indoor sessions. In outdoor sessions, they will put into practice the key concepts taught last term within football.
