Reading

The Iron Man by Ted Hughes is the story of a **giant man made of iron**, who wakes up in pieces on a beach, assembles himself, and sets about wandering the English countryside. He meets humans who initially fear him, though soon accept him. We will focus on developing our retrieval skills, making inferences and understanding vocabulary.



Writing

This term, we will create a character description of the Iron Man based on Ted Hughes' novel. We will then learn how to write a persuasive letter themed on the issues around plastic pollution and sustainability.

STEM

Maths

This term, we will be learning about methods for adding and subtracting 3-digit numbers, and multiplication and division. By the end of Year 3, children need to confidently recall all multiplication and division facts for the 2, 3, 4, 5 and 8 times tables. Regular practise on [Times Tables Rock Stars](#) will support this.



Science

Children will learn about magnets, magnetic forces and magnetic poles. They will predict, investigate, test and make conclusions based on their results.

Computing

Pupils are participating in a LEAP project with professional dancers and digital technology producers to access areas of the computing / dance / music curriculum, in various modern real-life relevant ways.

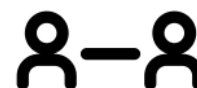
Personal

Physical Education

Children will participate in Gymnastics within their indoor sessions. In outdoor sessions, they will put into practice the key concepts taught last term within football. PE kit includes a purple t-shirt, black shorts/jogging bottoms, trainers and a purple fleece. Earrings should be removed on PE days.

This term, our PSHE learning will focus on the development of safe relationships with family and friends. We will also be talking about how to respect ourselves and others.



The Arts

Music

In Music this half term, children will develop their ability to sing in parts. We will start with establishing technique and posture, trying rounds and some simple two part songs.

Art

In Art, we will be focusing on sculpture, recycling, shape and form. Children will be creating a 'nature' sculpture in the style of Andy Goldsworthy.

Humanities

Geography

We will be learning about UK cities and counties with a focus on local geography. We will then look at the impact of humans on the environment in a study on sustainability.



Religious Education

Children will continue learning about the deeper meanings of the festivals from several different faiths, including a study on how and why they are celebrated.
