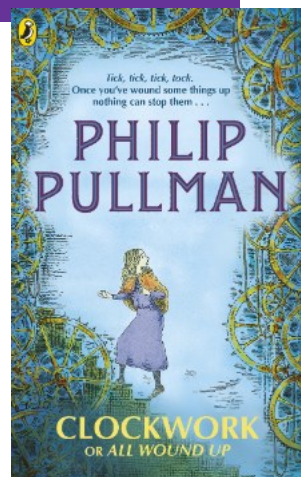
All Wound Up

Reading

Our class text is 'Clockwork' by Phillip Pullman. The book centres on apprentice clock-maker Karl, who must craft a new figure for the great clock in town - but he is exceedingly short on inspiration. When a mysterious little clockwork character appears from nowhere, Karl seems to have found the answer to his prayers. We will continue to use VIPERS skills in lessons.



Writing

In Writing this half term, pupils in Year 6 will be exploring different fiction and non-fiction genres, including a mixed genre story and a recount. In these units of work, they will learn how to use passive voice sentences, vary their sentence openers for cohesion including progressive verbs, subordinate clauses and prepositional phrases. They will also explore how to use a variety of figurative language techniques to develop their purpose and intent for writing.

STEM

Maths

Pupils will learn about equivalences between fractions, decimals and percentages. They will also work out percentages of an amount and solve problems. In addition, pupils will learn to calculate area and perimeter of 2D shapes and volume of 3D shapes, how to read and interpret graphs and charts and how to calculate the mean. Children should practise their times tables at least 3 times per week on Times Tables Rock Stars and also use My Maths for their homework and to practise other maths-based skills.

Science

This term, children will be learning about 'evolution', including how organisms have adapted to their environment and how this is linked to adaptations over long periods. They will research the ideas of Charles Darwin and how his book 'The Origin of the Species' changed opinions about life on Earth.

Personal Development

Physical Education

During this half term in PE, pupils will be practising some key concepts such as marking, switching play, using width and channelling in Tag Rugby. In their indoor PE lessons, Year 6 will be learning to play Basketball. They will be developing their dribbling, passing, defending and shooting skills. Pupils will learn to cooperate as a team to keep possession of the ball and play competitively against others.

The Arts

DT

This half term, the pupils in Year 6 will be learning about textiles. They will evaluate different wall hangings as a starting point to design and create their own.

Computing

Children will learn about spreadsheets, finding out how to organise data into columns and rows to create their own data set. Learners will be introduced to formulas and begin to understand how they can be used to produce calculations.

PSHE

This term in PSHE, pupils will continue to learn about how to keep personal information and themselves safe. They will be taught how to evaluate media sources and consider what to share online. The unit will also cover learning about finance and teach pupils important skills of budgeting and considering 'want vs 'need' when it comes to spending money.

Music

Children will use traditional notation to document compositions and play other composers' music. They will identify structure and musical pattern in songs and develop confidence and expression in performance.



Humanities

History

Pupils will be studying the Tudor time period of British history. Using a variety of sources, they will be learning about aspects of life in this period, including King Henry VIII and his wives, Tudor jobs, homes and significant events.



French

Children will learn how to tell the time: o'clock, half past, quarter past, quarter to and 5 minute intervals. They will learn how to use 24 hour times and the way in which the French represent a.m. and p.m. The children will use airport arrival and departure boards and a school timetable to consolidate and practise the skills learned.

MyMaths — Children log on and complete the set questions.
