

#### Reading

During our class reading time, we will explore the book 'The Tunnel' by Anthony Browne. This book will give the context for us to discuss such things as worry, co-operation, curiosity, responsibility and being a risk taker. The story follows a 'there and back' structure, meaning that a character goes somewhere and has to find their way back

#### Writing

We will be writing stories with suspense, which will be based on Hansel and Gretel. This story also follows a 'there and back' structure. The grammar we will focus on is to write sentences with different forms (exclamations, statements, commands and questions) and to use contracted words (I'll, we'll, should've). Our non-fiction unit is letter writing, where we will write a letter from a distant place. The grammar we will focus on includes using subordinating conjunctions (when, if, because) and co-ordinating conjunctions (or, and, but). We'll also be developing our use of extended noun phrases to help us describe a location.


#### Tier 2 vocabulary

#### Spellings

Practise your spellings at least 3 times per week on Spelling



### Malhs STEM

We will be tearning about fractions to begin with this term. Children will learn how to recognise a half and a quarter of a shape, and work out these fractions of amounts too. We'll then move on to learn about thirds. Finally, we'll learn to count in fractions from 0 to 1 whole. We'll look at both unit and non-unit (a numerator more than 1) fractions. We'll then move on to learning to tell the time, with a focus on reading a clock to the nearest 5 minute interval.

#### Science

This term, we will be learning about plants. We'll revisit our learning from year I by naming the parts of a plant. We'll plant bulbs and observe them over time to see how they grow. We'll experiment with watering, giving light and changing the temperature to see what impact these things have on the growth of a plant. We'll learn the basic difference between seeds and bulbs.

## Personal Development

#### Physical Education-

Children will practise and participate in a variety of athletics events such as a 15 metre sprint, bean bag throw and obstacle race. Children will learn the skills in order to compete in this year's Sports Day (date to be confirmed), where they will enjoy keeping fit and healthy whilst embracing competition and team work effectively.

### The Arts

#### Arl

In Art, we will be exploring primary colours and experimenting to make secondary colours using paint and other resources. We will also be using different brush strokes to create different effects in our work. This will be linked with our Science work, where we will look closely at plants and use our Art skills to recreate a detailed picture of a plant.

#### Computing

In computing, year 2 will be using a computer to create music. They will listen to a variety of pieces of music and consider how music can

make them think and feel. Learners will compare creating music digitally and non-digitally.

#### Personal. Social and Health Education

This half term, we will be exploring money and looking at ways to save and spend. We will identify ways to be responsible and show our understanding of the differences between our needs and wants.

#### Music

In Music this half term, children will start to use Glockenspiels. They will play short patterns and be introduced to pitched notation. We will learn about the proper technique for beater hold and how to make a good sound.

#### History

Year 2 will be exploring the lives of significant individuals in the past that have contributed to national and international achievements. Comparisons will be used to discuss aspects of life in different periods.

#### RE

We are learning about how and why we celebrate some significant times. The children will research and embrace the celebrations of a variety of faith such as Christianity and Islam.
