### Personal. Social and Health Education

This term, we will be learning about health and wellbeing focusing on healthy Habits: sun safety. medicines, vaccinations, immunisations and allergies. We will move on to looking at money and work.



### The Arts

This term, we will be studying sculpture and working in clay, linking to Ancient Greek vases and statues. We will study the work of Exekias, Henry Moore and Barbara Hepworth.



#### Music

This half term, children will learn to play several basic chords on the Ukulele, allowing them to play numerous songs as an ensemble. Pupils will be exposed to a variety of genres within the selection of pieces, allowing them to make judgements and appreciate a wide range of composers and musicians.



### History

We will be studying Ancient Greece. We will look at how ancient artegacts inform us about Greek life, particularly the role of women. We will learn about their achievements and their influence on the western world, with a focus on the Olympics, the rivalry between Sparta and Alhens and the Trojan War.



### Religious Education

In RE, we will learn what matters most to Humanists and Christians. We will look to understand how moral ideals like right and wrong are developed.
