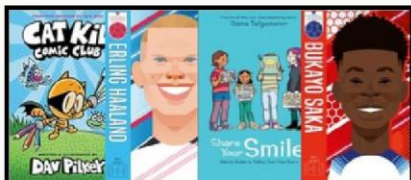
In June, we focused on Refugee Week.

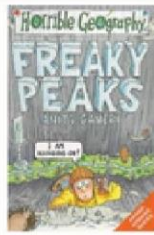

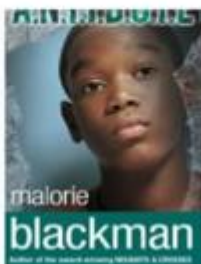


Find this book in the library...
