

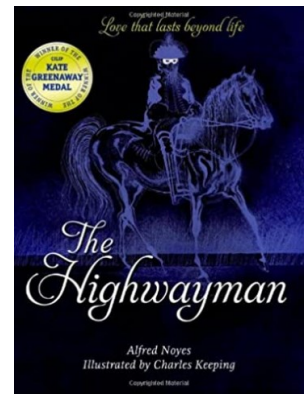

English

Reading

Our class text for this half term is 'The Highwayman' by Alfred Noyes. The poem, set in 18th-century rural England, tells the story of an unnamed highwayman who is in love with Bess. We will also read a short version of Romeo and Juliet. The skills we will focus on learning are VIPERS (vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation, retrieval and summarising).



Writing

This term, we will be learning to write a horror story, with a focus on adding dialogue between characters. We'll be watching two short films, Alma and Francis, alongside studying great examples to help us develop the most scary narrative we can. We will also be learning to write a discussion text based on a current topic.

STEM

Maths

This half term, we will focus on learning about how to add and subtract fractions and mixed numbers, how to multiply and divide fractions by an integer, how to simplify fractions and how to compare and order fractions. We will also be learning to convert units of measure. As always, times tables form the basis of so many other areas of Maths. Children should practise their times tables at least 3 times per week on [Times Tables Rock Stars](#).

Science

This term, we will be learning about animals including humans. We will focus on identifying and naming the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describing the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood. We will investigate and recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way our bodies function.

Physical Education

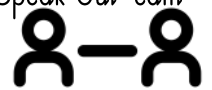
This term, your child will be learning how to participate in, and play, netball games. They will also be learning and choreographing a dance to a piece of music. Computing

Pupils will be introduced to creating websites. They will identify what makes a good web page and use this information to design and evaluate their own website using Google Sites. Throughout the process, learners pay specific attention to copyright and fair use of media.

The Arts



DT

This term, we will focus on cooking and nutrition. We will be researching, planning, preparing and cooking bread, applying our knowledge of ingredients and technical skills.

Music

In Music this half term, children will be looking at Hip Hop music and creating their own pieces using technology. They will produce an appropriate beat, set the tempo, compose a bass line, add a melody, and select a sampled rap. We'll explore additional effects, creating interest and texture changes before finishing with mixing the track.



Humanities

History

In History, we will be learning about crime and punishment through different historical periods.

RE

We are looking at influences that effect our world views. What is your worldview and what has influenced it? We will be discussing which beliefs are important to us and why and we will be studying Social Science and data.

French

In French lessons this half term, pupils will be learning about the shopping experience in France. Pupils will learn to use colours to describe items of clothing, learn key phrases for asking questions and role-play going shopping in France using their newly acquired vocabulary.
