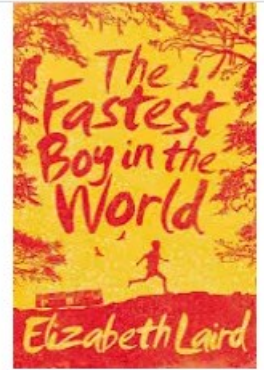

# English

## Reading

Our class text is 'The Fastest Boy in the World' by Elizabeth Laird. Set in Ethiopia, the main protagonist is eleven-year-old Solomon. He loves to run and dreams of being a gold-medal-winning athlete. It follows the trials and tribulations of a young boy supporting his grandfather and following his dreams. The skills we will focus on learning this term are: improving our speed with retrieval from the text and developing our understanding of vocabulary.



## Writing

This term, we will be learning to write a setting description, including animals around an African waterhole. Later on in the term, we will be writing a persuasive letter about an issue that is important to us.

This term, our PSHE learning will continue to focus on the development of safe relationships with family and friends, both online and in the real world. We will be talking about how to respect ourselves and others.

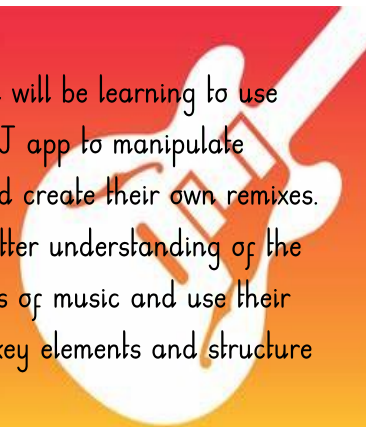
# The Arts
