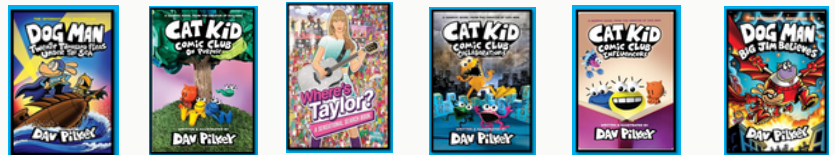
Book of the Week

Chatterbooks Club

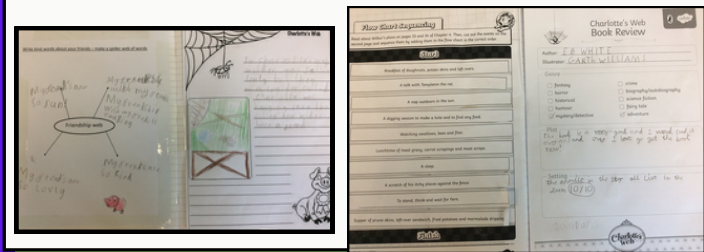
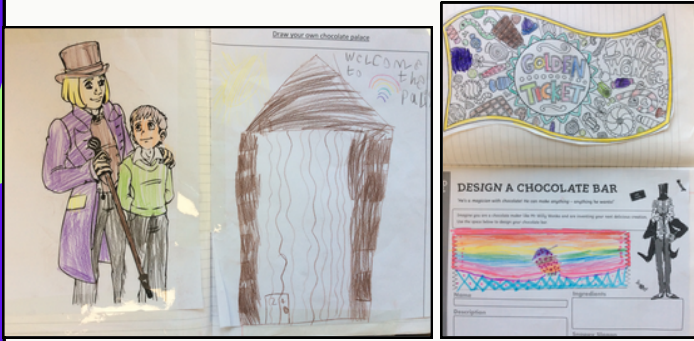
This term in Chatterbooks Club, we have been looking at different books and basing an activity on each chapter.
