

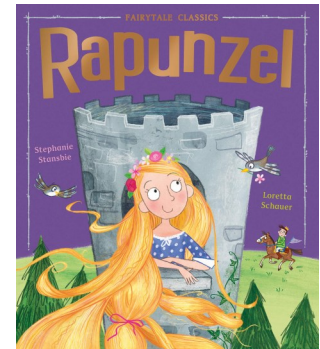
Year 1

English

Reading

We will focus on several traditional tales such as Sleeping Beauty and Rapunzel, understanding how the characters are feeling and why. As we are learning about the human body in Science, the children will learn to identify a range of features in non-fiction texts.



Writing

This term, we will be using a range of adjectives to describe characters in a story and we will be able to use our understanding of non-fiction texts to label the human body. We will be using our Kinetic Letters scheme to support our handwriting: focusing on forming the letters correctly and sitting them on the line.

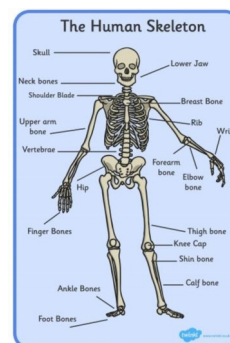
STEM

Maths

This term, we will be learning about the place value of digits and their importance. We will introduce the children to strategies and methods to help solve addition and subtraction problems and we will be practising number bonds to 10.

Science

We will be learning about the parts of the human body, both inside and out, and the importance of the senses. We will also be learning about different materials. The children will predict, test and evaluate ideas and present their findings in different ways.

Physical Education

This term, your child will be learning how to improve their balancing skills and co-ordination in Gymnastics. They will also understand fundamental skills in outdoor PE. Children should come to school dressed in their PE kit.

The children will be looking at the idea of beginning and belonging, as well as developing an understanding of our whole school values.



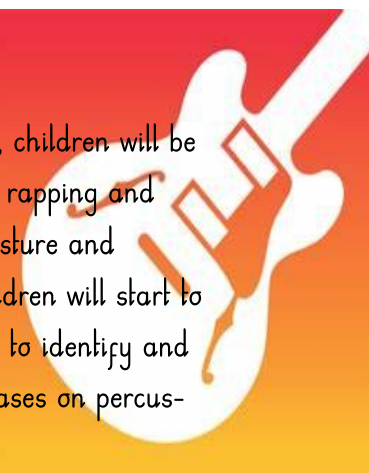
The Arts

Art

This term, we will be looking at self portraits, with particular focus on single line drawing and collage. Artists that we will use for inspiration include; Pablo Picasso, Frida Kahlo and Maria Rivans.

Music

In Music this half term, children will be developing their unison rapping and singing, focusing on posture and breathing properly. Children will start to use their listening skills to identify and copy short musical phrases on percussion instruments.
